Interpreter Training Course

Who is the course aimed at?

Anyone who is fluent in English and one other language and is interested in interpreting for the counsellor and the client during a counselling session.

Who is eligible for the course?

- You need to be fluent in English – specifically being able to speak and understand English clearly.
- You need to have been in the UK for at least 12 months as all interpreters working or volunteering at Portsmouth Counselling Service are subject to a Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) check.
- You do not have to be eligible to work in the UK as you can attend the course and volunteer your services. We actively encourage asylum seekers to attend the training.

How much does the course cost?

The course is free and forms part of a larger Cross Cultural Counselling Project which is funded by the Big Lottery.

When and where does the course run?

The course will run over 3 days from 10am – 4pm each day.

How do I apply for a place?

On receipt of this you will then be informed if you have a place on the course.

What happens after the course?

Once you have completed the training you will be able to work as an interpreter for Portsmouth Counselling Service (PCS). You will need to sign a Code of Practice and undertake a CRB check prior to commencing work.

The interpreting hours offered by PCS depend upon the languages required by the clients and so regular work cannot be guaranteed. The hours are flexible (daytime and evening) and will be arranged to suit the counsellor, client and yourself.

Paid work is available for those eligible to work. If you are not eligible you may volunteer your services and expenses will be reimbursed.
